






Short Synopsis

The rare instance of a musical thriller, Stephen Sondheim and Hugh Wheeler's chilling, suspenseful, heart-pounding masterpiece of murderous barber-ism and culinary crime tells the infamous tale of the unjustly exiled barber who returns to 19th century London seeking revenge against the lecherous judge who framed him and ravaged his young wife. His thirst for blood soon expands to include his unfortunate customers, and the resourceful

proprietress of the pie shop downstairs soon has the people of London lining up in droves with her mysterious new meat pie recipe! Sophisticated, macabre, visceral and uncompromising, SWEENEY TODD nevertheless has a great sense of fun, mixing intense drama with howlingly funny moments of dark humour: audiences find themselves laughing hysterically one moment and gasping in surprise the next. At the show's core is a challenging score of epic proportion with two tasty tour de force roles in Sweeney and his comic female accomplice Mrs. Lovett.

Character Breakdown

SWEENEY TODD: A talented barber with a bloodthirsty need for revenge. Ab2 - F4 Baritone or Bass.

ANTHONY HOPE: A young man who returns to London and sets his heart on Johanna, Todd's daughter. C3 - F#4 Tenor.

BEGGAR WOMAN: A deranged and schizophrenic woman with a secret. A3 - F#5 Alto.

ENSEMBLE: Townspeople, Lords, Ladies, Policemen, Lunatics, etc. **JOHANNA:** Judge Turpin's young, lovely ward and Todd's long-lost daughter. Innocent and aching to free

herself from Turpin's grasp. C4 - Bb5 Soprano.

JONAS FOGG: The owner of Fogg's sanitarium.

JUDGE TURPIN: A corrupt and lecherous official who hides in the guise of sanctimonious honour. B2 - F4 Baritenor. There are passages in "Pretty Women (Part I)" and other songs where TURPIN sings down to an F1 (can be sung an octave higher, if necessary).


MRS. LOVETT: An entrepreneurial shop owner with a diabolical passion for pies...and Todd. F#3 - E5 Alto - with a good low range.

PIRELLI: A flamboyant Italian with a secret past. A charlatan and rival barber. G#2 - F#4 Tenor - Formally trained. There is a high A in "The Contest", but A, an octave lower, is indicated as ossia. Therefore, having the high A is desired, but not crucial.

THE BEADLE: A pompous public official whose real loyalty is only to the corrupt Turpin. Bb2 - F4 Tenor - There is a high C (C5) in "Kiss Me" (Part II).

TOBIAS RAGG: A young boy/man who is apprenticed to Pirelli, but finds a strange, surrogate family in Todd and Mrs. Lovett. B2 - G4 Tenor.

MID YEAR SHOWCASE 13, 14 June 2014


Family and friends of our students enjoyed a night jam-packed with amazing work from the 60+ students in the Senior Musical Theatre program.

- it has been a delightful trip down memory lane and an enlightening look at just


how many wonderful shows Spotlight has produced (some on multiple occasions)

EARLY REVUE SHOWS

Proceeds from these revues aided local charities



High Jinks was the first show and was staged at the Diggers' Hall, in Southport early February 1955. It ran for 3 days and the proceeds aided the Olympic Swimming Pool. Joyce Williams (later Forbes) produced the show and Isabel Williams came in as pianist with 3 days notice when the orchestra pulled out.

Numerous local businesses supported the newly formed Revue company by taking out advertisements in the programme. It is interesting to note that the phone numbers on these adverts were 3 digits only (how times have changed). *Frills and Frolics* followed at the end of April 28th,29th and 2nd May.

There seemed to be some indecision as to the name of our Company, with *Gals and Gags* listed as Spotlight Revue Co. early July, then *Krazy Kapers* in December back under the Southcoast Revue banner.



1956 saw the season of *Bandantics* (by Spotlight & Spotlite Revue Company) extend to 4 days, with an extra performance in Murwillumbah. These performances aided the Queensland Band Championship Fund and the Murwillumbah X.L.S.R. Band. The Spotlite Revue Co. also performed at Charity events from time to time. There were two shows in 1957, *Going Places* and *Anything Goes*, aiding the Southport Olympic Swimming Pool Committee and The Southport State

High School respectively and the producer was now Spotlite Revue Company and it stayed that way until mid August 1963.

Laffiesta, Happy Snaps, Pleasure Cruise (all in 1958) and then in 1959 Fine and Dandy, Fanfare and Keep It Gay when our current President Patricia Drew (nee O'Shea) joined the company as a dancer. Since her return to Spotlight in latter years Patsy has been a source of inspiration to many, supporting all the hardworking staff and volunteers and spending most show evenings at the theatre in her role as President. She has steered the Committee in a very positive manner through hard economic times and some difficult circumstances.

In 1960 Pauline Davies joined the cast of **Sugar & Spice** and Maurice Hansell came to Spotlight for the next show **Beatin' the Blues**. Pauline was very active in every aspect of Spotlight for

many years (to name a few – Committee, Secretary, Library, Golden Girls) and still holds most of our records and is a great source of information. Maurice had a great tenor voice and sense of comedy and was President, 1965-6, 1980-82, 1986-7, 1988-9. He and Fay (nee Schneider as she was known in early productions) were very active in early as well as latter years. Fay left the footlights to raise their family and worked behind the scenes tirelessly. For many years she took over the Costume Hire Shop from Stella Mary Matheson (nee Roberts)





who had also worked tirelessly for the Company and had set the path for Costume Hire as an income earner for the Company. Final shows for 1960 were **Bubbling Over** in September/ October and Old Favourites in December. This last show was

produced by Marilyn Green and Billie Whyte. Marilyn had been a leading member for five years, being a major dancer, excelling in tap and demi-character routines. She trained in Sydney and now Directs the Golden Girls' shows.

Billie Whyte, had also been with the company from its inception and possessed a beautiful alto voice as well as being a brilliant choreographer. Billie coached many members in their routines and was always on hand to

help with costumes even though she was a busy mother of two at the time.

Riot in Rythm (1961) was co-produced by Graham Hodge (who became Marilyn Green's husband) and Maurie Jennings who had come from the Gold Coast Little Theatre 4 years earlier. Maurie was a competent dancer, natural comedian and a talented singer. He was also pianist for a local orchestra.

Graham, a young school teacher had been with the Revue company for 5 years and had previously co-produced *Keep it Gay* with Marilyn. He was a Ballroom Dancing Medallist and excelled in all routines. He produced amazing backdrops

After this came *Fun in the Sun* co-directed by Billie Whyte and Judith Young and then *Words and Music* directed by Sandra Crane and Ann Hoskins.

1962 saw the season start with a January pantomime *Babes in the Wood* directed by





Joyce Forbes (nee Williams) and Maurie Jennings. This was followed by *Startime* co-directed by Marilyn Hodge and Val Tuesley and *Sounds Terrific* co-directed by Graham Hodge and Maurie Jennings.

A quote from Graham's Director note:

"In addition to attending the tedious hours of rehearsal, many members of the cast become responsible for laborious chores — choreography, costume making, scenery painting, advertising, to mention but a few of the many tasks.

Founder of the Revue concept at this time, Joyce Forbes, introduced the next production **Brigadoon** – the start of many musicals that were to follow.
