



Short Synopsis

The rare instance of a musical thriller, Stephen Sondheim and Hugh Wheeler's chilling, suspenseful, heart-pounding masterpiece of murderous barber-ism and culinary crime tells the infamous tale of the unjustly exiled barber who returns to 19th century London seeking revenge against the lecherous judge who framed him and ravaged his young wife. His thirst for blood soon expands to include his unfortunate customers, and the resourceful proprietress of the pie shop downstairs soon has the people of London lining up in droves with her mysterious new meat pie recipe!

Sophisticated, macabre, visceral and uncompromising, SWEENEY TODD nevertheless has a great sense of fun, mixing intense drama with howlingly funny moments of dark humour: audiences find themselves laughing hysterically one moment and gasping in surprise the next. At the show's core is a challenging score of epic proportion with two tasty tour de force roles in Sweeney and his comic female accomplice Mrs. Lovett.

Character Breakdown

SWEENEY TODD: A talented barber with a bloodthirsty need for revenge. Ab2 - F4 Baritone or Bass.

ANTHONY HOPE: A young man who returns to London and sets his heart on Johanna, Todd's daughter. C3 - F#4 Tenor.

BEGGAR WOMAN: A deranged and schizophrenic woman with a secret. A3 - F#5 Alto. **ENSEMBLE:** Townspeople, Lords, Ladies, Policemen, Lunatics, etc.

JOHANNA: Judge Turpin's young, lovely ward and Todd's long-lost daughter. Innocent and aching to free herself from Turpin's grasp. C4 - Bb5 Soprano.

JONAS FOGG: The owner of Fogg's sanitarium.


JUDGE TURPIN: A corrupt and lecherous official who hides in the guise of sanctimonious honour. B2 - F4 Baritenor. There are passages in "Pretty Women (Part I)" and other songs where TURPIN sings down to an F1 (can be sung an octave higher, if necessary).

MRS. LOVETT: An entrepreneurial shop owner with a diabolical passion for pies...and Todd. F#3 - E5 Alto - with a good low range.

PIRELLI: A flamboyant Italian with a secret past. A charlatan and rival barber. G#2 - F#4 Tenor - Formally trained. There is a high A in "The Contest", but A, an octave lower, is indicated as ossia. Therefore, having the high A is desired, but not crucial.

THE BEADLE: A pompous public official whose real loyalty is only to the corrupt Turpin. Bb2 - F4 Tenor - There is a high C (C5) in "Kiss Me" (Part II).

TOBIAS RAGG: A young boy/man who is apprenticed to Pirelli, but finds a strange, surrogate family in Todd and Mrs. Lovett. B2 - G4 Tenor.

SOUTH COAST REVUE COMPANY — THE YEARS OF THE REVUE PROCEEDS FROM THESE REVUES AIDED LOCAL CHARITIES

ounder Joyce Williams (later Forbes) had returned from Toowoomba after her father died in 1954 to be with her mother. Late that year she started rehearsing her first musical revue after rounding up a team of family members and locals. "High Jinks" went to stage at the Diggers' Hall, Southport in February 1955 the year before the Olympic




Games in Melbourne. It ran for three nights and Fred Hodgson (Joyce's driving instructor and father of Shirlie Foxover) was on the Stage Management Team and also the Southport Olympic Pool Committee. He persuaded the O.P. Committee to use the show as a fundraiser. Cec Carey, the current Member of Parliament at the time was quite sceptical, feeling the show would be too amateurish. However after the show he went on stage and declared it the best amateur production he had ever seen. He later became our patron for many years. Spotlight productions to this day are declared "the best" by many patrons.

Involved with that first revue were many who were an integral part of the forming of our Company. Alf Williams was part of the male quartet and his wife Isabel stepped into the role of pianist with a week's notice when the orchestra pulled out. Isabel (Mrs Will as she was fondly known) continued in that role, as well as MD for many years until her death in 1994. I don't ever remember Isabel missing a rehearsal in all that time, and she was always willing to rehearse at her home should a soloist need additional rehearsals. She and some of the ladies in the Company used to entertain round the nursing homes and senior citizen venues in the sixties-seventies but as full time work intruded it was abandoned until 1990 when she and Pauline Davies formed the Spotlight Golden Girls which is still very active to this day.

In 1969 Isabel conceived the Spotlight Entertainers Festival which had run every year since that time until the last couple of years when we had to cancel because of lack of volunteers to help with the Festival. Many competitors went on to become famous in the entertainment world - the Horsey brothers (Drew and Chris), Sophie Monk, Zara Grose, Aaron Smythe and the list goes on. Chris Harris (along with husband Paul) and Lea Vosti continued organising this event for many years after Isabel's death.


Alf's work in lighting and sets was remarkable - making overhead lights out of large cans; numerous slides to house coloured film; designing a large rose for a ballet girl to step out of.

There are just so many people who helped Spotlight to become the Company it is today. If you are interested in knowing more about Spotlight's early years you may be lucky enough to find a copy of "A Fairytale Musical History of the [Spotlight] Theatre" 1955-2001 hanging around the complex. Unfortunately copies were lost when we had a roof cave-in in recent time. ...
