

# THE SPOTLIGHT THEATRICAL COMPANY'S ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING



### held TUESDAY 18th AUGUST, 2015

The meeting resulted in the following Councillors being elected into office for the year September 2015 – August 2016:

**Committee** – Tony Alcock, Brock Dunstan, Erica Graham, Martina French, Shirley King, Val Leftwich, Jamie Watt and Terri Woodfine.

In the Anniversary of our 60th year LIFE MEMBERSHIP was bestowed on David McNeven.

**David** is a graduate of the Queensland Conservatorium of Music where he studied piano and voice. After graduating, he studied voice for a further two years with Professor Janet Delpratt and Gregory Massingham. In his late twenties and early thirties he sang with the Brisbane Chorale, toured to Hong Kong with the Conservatorium Singers and was a member of the successful vocal octet, Jones and Co. directed by Michael Leighton-Jones.

David is now retired from teaching after a long and respected career as a High School Music Teacher with Education Queensland in Brisbane and Toowoomba but mostly here on the Gold Coast. His last appointment was to Nerang State High School where he taught for twenty years.

David joined Spotlight Theatre in 1986 when he moved to the Gold Coast, quickly establishing himself as a performer, repetiteur and Musical Director. His on stage roles have included Motel the Tailor (*Fiddler on the Roof* 1989) the Captain (*Dames at Sea* 1991) for which he was also Musical Director, Paul (*Company* 1997) and more

recently as the Butler/Underling (*The Drowsy Chaperone*) for which he was also MD. Among others for which he has been MD for Spotlight include *Can Can* 1995, *Working* 1998, *Follies* 2003, *Kiss Me Kate*, 2007, *A Chorus Line* 2008, *HMS Pinafore* 2009, *Crazy for You* 2010, *Blood Brothers* 2012. He has more recently played piano for many shows including some where he was MD, and lately *Dusty* 2011, *Seussical* 2012 and *High School Musical* 2015.

His expert services extended to Spotlight Youth Theatre where he was Musical Director and Vocal Coach for the Spotlight High School Music classes for five years from 2009.

David's love of chamber music prompted him to organise two fund-raising events for the Theatre: The first Sunday afternoon concert in 2003 was for a piano trio in which David played the Company's then new concert piano and in the second concert (*Classical Cupcakes* 2012) was with his string trio in which David played 'Cello.

Outside Spotlight, David enjoys a role as an accompanist, plays 'cello and piano in Northern Rivers Symphony

Orchestra, plays piano for the Gold Coast Chamber Orchestra and sings tenor with the Brisbane Concert Choir. David has been involved in many Arts Centre Gold Coast productions both onstage and in the pit. In 2012, David sang in the especially formed Mahler Chorus to perform *Mahler's Second Symphony* with the visiting Hamburg Orchestra conducted by Simone Young at QPAC and in 2014 David sang in the Gold Coast Community Chorus for the Australian Opera's inaugural Opera on the Beach production of Mozart's *The Magic Flute* at Coolangatta.

He is also an accomplished film actor. His leading role in Sovereign had Brisbane newspapers talking. He has trained under some of the best in the business such as Tom McSweeney and Phil Holder from the Warehouse Workshop, also the world renowned Ivanna Chubbick. He received his Diploma of Musical Theatre in 2013 from Gold Coast Triple Threat with dreams of making it to Broadway

JAMIE WATT Jamie is a multi-disciplined performer who has been treading the boards nationally for over a decade. His performance career began with the Gold Coast Arts Centre, where he starred in 26 main stage productions, under the direction of Robert Young. He would later work as assistant to the Director and Dance Captain on several shows for the company. In 2009 Jamie toured nationally in the cast of Buddy: The Buddy Holly Story The Musical as the Clearlake MC and understudy to Big Bopper and several supporting characters as well as Dance Captain. Other theatre credits include: Sweeney Todd starring Rob Guest, Grease, Chess, Godspell, The Boy From Oz, Jekyll and Hyde Australian Premiere starring Rob Guest and recently Legally Blonde at Spotlight.

In 2011 Jamie won the Gold Coast Area Theatre Award for his portrayal of Chad in **All Shook Up** for Pheonix Ensemble, which he later directed/choreographed for Spotlight in 2012.



# **AUDITION DOs and DON'Ts**

A lot of people ask me (and others in the industry): "What should I do at my audition!?" I hear this question all the time and I finally decided to do something about it. This is by no means a complete list of everything you \*should\* or \*shouldn't\* do, but it's a good list and these things should always be taken into consideration. Especially if you're just starting out, it helps make you look even more professional. It should be noted, I did not write this list. I got this list from people I know who work in casting, but they shall remain anonymous for now.

### **DOs**

**DO BE PREPARED:** Show up on time, read everything ahead of time, Google everything you can. If it can be answered from Google it should. Know who you're reading with and for. Be as prepared as the casting directors.

**DO** always carry a physical picture/resume with you. Keep a stack of ten in your bag. Consider it your business card.

**DO** have an index for your book. You shouldn't have to flip through to find things. Be organized by title, uptempo/ballad, contemporary/classic.

DO follow directions! If someone says submit to a specific email address, USE IT! Confirm all appointments!

**DO** stick to the script. Unless you've been given directions to improvise, you should always read the script.

**DO** ASK if you need to be rescheduled.

**DO** treat it like a job interview. That's what it is.

**DO** always assume you're the first or last appointment, you never know when they're starting or ending. Don't show up early or late, you might get there before or after the casting directors.

**DO** dress professionally.

**DO** be nice to everyone. You never know who you're talking to. The reader and monitor might be very important people.

**DO** know who you're auditioning for. If you don't know the auditioner, don't make assumptions. Feel free to ask the monitor who is in the room.

**DO** assume there will be no chair to work with.

**DO** assess the room when you walk in. Where is the casting team, where is pianist, etc. etc.

**DO** forget about it when you're done. They can't call everyone. The best audition you can have is getting a callback or a call for another project. If they're willing to audition you again for the same project or another project is as good as booking the job where the casting director is concerned. A successful audition is one where the team will have you audition again for them.

### **DON'TS**

**DON'T** offer a handshake. Especially during flu season. No need to introduce yourself, we know who you are if you have an appointment.

**DON'T** wear perfume. Your audition shouldn't be associated with a smell. You shouldn't be wearing enough or be close enough for them to smell you.

**DON'T** ask questions for the sake of asking questions, only ask if necessary. If it doesn't change your reading, don't ask.

**DON'T** bother memorizing. Put all your energy into doing a good job, don't focus on

remembering the next word, just read it. Focus on your performance. Read through the piece and make choices.

**DON'T** apologize for your performance. Don't give excuses. They'll either like it or they don't.

**DON'T** skip an audition. If you can't make it, send a courtesy email. A cancellation is better than a no-show. (For appointments)

**DON'T** wear a costume. If the character could go shopping in your closet, wear that.

**DON'T** be nervous. Appear like a working actor, this should be old-hat for you.

**DON'T** touch ANYONE during your audition ever. Do not use props that look like weapons. Do not hit or kiss anyone, EVER.

**DON'T** complain about the reader or the accompanist, they work for the casting director and the show's team. If there was a huge problem, they noticed it, you don't need to point it out.

**DON'T** come too close to the table. They're likely writing about you.
