first opened in 1992. It was a return to the big traditional musical of laughter, showmanship and dance.





The Lank Hawkins Saloon Bar is the drinking hole of the 'wannabe' locals who entertain themselves bv scaring tourists to Deadrock with a gunfight and good old western punch-up. The unsuspecting tourist is left in

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terror for a few moments, then the locals spring back up to continue their boring run of the mill life. Enough excitement for one day!

In *Crazy For You*, the worst case scenario arises - should the show go on? Or should the cast quit while ahead? At a meeting where the cast gather to debate the options, they are inspired by a stalwart British motto 'Stiff Upper Lip'. The dejected cast raise their morale pulling themselves up by their bootlaces, until they are bursting with enthusiasm and desire in the face of adversity. They build a mock barricade, and perch Polly (Rachel Love) precariously on the pinnacle patriotically flying the Stars and Stripes. Of course the show does go on, and dear readers, you had better get your tickets booked before you miss the opportunity to see it.

The back stage crew and technical support are all involved at the sharp end now, and like everyone else in the show, there is no such thing as 'spare'

or 'down' time as the finishing touches and final polish are put on each scene, each costume and each choreographic routine so that once again the patrons of Spotlight Theatre will enjoy a show of the calibre to which they are accustomed.


FROM ASHLEY'S DESK




