WHAT YOU **MISSED** IF YOU DIDN'T GET TO SEE



Excerpts from some wonderful reviews and comments about

February 9th, 1964 somewhere in New York (or so the story goes) four handsome members of an up-andcoming boy's harmony group were travelling in their shiny red Ford Mercury en-route to pick up their smart new plaid dinner jackets when they were hit by a bus carrying a gaggle of excited catholic schoolgirls. The girls escaped uninjured

... the four boys bouncing along in their smart convertible, practicing their harmonies and dreaming of cutting their first single and

a subsequent life on the stage were

killed instantly.

Jump forward to 2012 and the intimate basement of the Spotlight Theatre on the Gold Coast of Australia and the gathered crowd are about to witness an extraordinary apparition. Almost 50 years have passed and our four young heroes,

Sparky, Smudge, Jinx and Frankie, are afforded one last chance to return to Earth to give the concert they never had the opportunity of

performing "in life".

In reality, Forever Plaid is a jukebox musical in which Spotlight director, Ryan Wilson fell in love whilst visiting America some sixteen years ago ... and I can see why. This is a wonderful piece of theatre. It's simple, well structured, has some very funny dialogue and it utilises an entertaining catalogue of popular songs from

that harmonic-musical era. Of course the great challenge for Mr Wilson in staging his dream script after all these years would be finding four guys to fill the four vital roles. Four men with

> vibrant stage presence who could not only sing in perfect harmony, but could remember (and deliver) extensive dialogue and possibly most difficult, play comedy.

> Enter Mark Daly, Ethan Jones, Adam King and Stewart Reeve. Smile boys ... now take a bow!

> In all my decades of working in and attending community

theatre, I have never heard such a tight pack of voices or enjoyed such an entertaining, thoroughly hilarious band of natural "musical comics". I can't single any one out

> ... I won't even begin to give examples of their wonderful, well rehearsed and tightly timed performances (except to say who knew that a couple of dessert spoons and four poker faces could be so funny!) Gentlemen, I take my

hat off to you ... one and all.

The accompaniment was again simple, wonderfully effective. Supplied by and the exceptionally talented (if not slightly temperamental) Musical Director Matt Dennett on piano and Shannon Kelly confidently tickling the double bass.

And then there was the choreography – without doubt the fifth star of this show. Paulo Natividad has moved his four nimble heroes with some of the funniest, most entertaining and yet appropriate choreography I have seen in a long



time. He has captured the classic fluidity and often rather naff

movement of boy vocal groups of the period and caricatured it ever so wonderfully. Again, performed with great vigour, split-second

timing and hilarious dexterity by Messrs Daly, Jones, King and Reeve.

The stage design is well conceived and nicely finished. The costuming is indeed up to Spotlight's consistently high standard – the monogrammed "hero" jackets are well

worth the "50 year wait".

I have always worked on (and advocated) the following theory: It is better to choose a simple project and do it brilliantly, than try for something beyond your abilities and budget ... only to achieve mediocrity. This is an



excellent example of a simple show brilliantly executed. I thoroughly enjoyed *Forever Plaid*, downstairs at the Spotlight Theatre – my only disappointment is that it will only run for three weeks (I'd happily go again!) *Reproduced in full.*

out for more, every song that the 4 boys sang was returned with thundering applause. ... Singing in the closest of harmony, squabbling boyishly over the smallest intonations, the Plaids are a guaranteed smash with a series of well-loved songs and right-on patter that keep audiences laughing when they aren't humming along to some of the great nostalgic pop hits of the

'50s.

Smudge, Frankie, Sparky and Jinx have the dream of making it big on the airwaves until a Catholic school bus abruptly ends their lives before their Plaid career could begin. But the Mission of Harmony is a masterful force and for one night only the Plaids return to earth to perform the show they never got to do in real life. Tonight they are *Forever Plaid*.

Performing a strong repertoire of classics, including *Three Coins in the Fountain, Sixteen Tons, Perfidia, Lady of Spain, Scotland the Brave* (and many more), *Forever Plaid* dust off some

rusty choreography, over decades of nervousness and entertain with a plethora of props, musical gimmickry and audience chat in front of the house band; piano by musical director, Matt Dennett,

and double bass, Shannon Kelly.

Written by Stuart Ross and directed by Ryan Wilson, *Forever Plaid* is just what the doctor ordered in musical comedy laughs. The four cast Mark Daly, Ethan Jones, Adam King, and Stewart Reeve fit together well portraying the best friends, with equal skill in their solo and group singing. The real delight, however, is the choreography from Paulo Natividad, taking the barbershop classic moves and adding just that little bit too much, the extra flourish, that draws more laughter from the audience. Originally from Scotland, Alison is a full time teacher of English at a school in Brisbane's Bayside. In this production, her first experience of working with Spotlight, she is thrilled to

have been given the chance to play the tragic Mrs Johnstone. She has previously enjoyed leading roles in various other musicals including *Annie Get Your Gun* (Annie Oakley), *Brigadoon* (Fiona McKeith), *Nunsense* (Rev Mother) and *The King and I* (Anna Leonowens). In addition to indulging her passion for performing herself, both in musicals and other dramas, she has directed high school productions of *Oklahoma! Tim was recently short listed in the top 10 in Australia for the Bell Shakespeare Scholarship, and is about to complete his ATCL in individual acting skills. This is Patrick's third production on the Gold Coast since relocating from Canberra. He has recently appeared in productions at the Gold Coast Arts




Above: The Johnstone home - set progress





CAST DESCRIPTIONS

CHAD: Age Range: 25 – 35

Vocal Range: Baritone/Tenor with incredible falsetto

Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: The ultimate ladies man. Think 'Johnny Bravo'. Always shoots from the hip, and is a sucker for a beautiful lady. He is utterly; grotesquely Misogynistic in Act 1, and as the show progresses, Chad learns some valuable life lessons that see him grow to love what's on the inside. Must have a Bari/Tenor pop/rock voice and an insatiable presence, great movement skills, guitar ability an advantage. Must remind the audience of Elvis in his early days.

NATALIE HALLER/ED: Age Range: 18 – 25

Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo Broadway belt with a deep 'man voice'

Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: The true hero of the story, Natalie goes through a massive change and requires an actor who can follow her arc emotionally. Loveable, boyish and devious, Natalie will stop at nothing to get the man of her dreams, including dressing as a man for almost the entire show. Natalie must have excellent comedic timing and a voice to die for. Very plain look, mousy hair, boyish figure, but with a touch of inner vixen shining through. Excellent Alto/Mezzo with a fearless belt and movement skills required. A true leading lady role.

DENNIS: Age Range: 18 – 25

Vocal Range: Baritone/Tenor with a big belt Dance: Movement Essential

Character Description: A nerdy, letterman sweater wearing anti-hero that the audience must fall in love with. Dennis is the unsung hero of the show, whose desperation to win Natalie's heart is as heartwarming as it is pathetic. Dennis' story arc is huge and as such requires a performer with perfect comic timing and the voice of a 50's rock crooner. Must be a person the audience can root for. A shorter stature, very nerdy/weedy looking, good movement

ability and willing to be the butt of every joke. A knight in shining armour that never seems to get the girl.

SYLVIA: Age Range: 35 – 45

Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo with a showstopping belt

Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: A hard, weathered personality with a voice like a Sherman tank, no one messes with Sylvia. The owner of the town's run-down Honkytonk, Sylvia is a straight shooter who means business and lives for her daughter Lorraine. Superb comic timing and a very dry wit, this performer must have the ability to stop a show with their voice, and is a featured belter in most company numbers. Larger stature, plain looking with a hint of va va voom.

JIM HALLER: Age Range: 35 – 55

Vocal Range: Baritone Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: A sad sack who owns the local garage, Jim lost his wife years ago but has never recovered. The type of character with a permanent rain cloud over his head. Completely oblivious to Sylvia's attempts to admit her feelings for him, Jim goes through a complete change out of desperation. A performer the audience can't help feel sorry for. A shorter stature, hardened and mopey, must have fantastic comic timing.

MISS SANDRA: Age Range: 25 – 45 Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo with a huge belt Dance: Movement essential

Character Description: The classic romantic with a really wild streak, Miss Sandra really 'Let's herself go' throughout the show, the object of Chad's affections, Sandra must be ample and curvy in all the right places with a whole lot of va va voom. A fearless performer with fantastic comic timing and a voice to die for, she is an outsider in the town with more class in her little finger than anyone she comes across.

LORRAINE: Age Range: 15 – 20 Vocal Range: Alto/Mezzo Belter Dance: Excellent ability required Character Description: A typical hormonally charged teenager in love, Lorraine thinks all love is just like a Shakespearean story. A gorgeous girl, Lorraine works at Sylvia's Honky-Tonk and dreams of the day a handsome stranger will whisk her away. Very pretty young girl required with a sweet belt voice. Excellent dance ability is a must.

DEAN HYDE: Age Range: 15 – 20 Vocal Range: Baritone/ Tenor with some big belt notes

Dance: Excellent ability required

Character Description: A fool in love, the spark between Dean and Lorraine is evident and thus requires excellent chemistry. A very sheltered and naïve character who's only wish is to stay in town to be with the woman he loves, instead of being carted off to Military School by his dastardly mother, the town Mayor. A good looking young man with a sweet voice and a puppy dog face.

MAYOR MATILDA HYDE: Age Range: 40 – 60

Vocal Range: Mezzo/Soprano Dance: Movement Essential

Character Description: The dastardly character and scene stealer, Mayor Matilda Hyde is the disgruntled town leader who's mission is to remove every ounce of fun from the world. A very dry wit and excellent comedic timing required. Matilda has a way of sucking the fun out of a room, must make the audience hate and love her at the same time.

SHERRIF EARL: Age Range: 40 – 60 Vocal Range: Bass/Baritone

Dance: Movement Essential

Character Description: The dark horse, and ever so quiet, Sheriff Earl never speaks a word, until required. An inconspicuous performer with superb comic timing and a deep resonating voice, he really is a show stealer.

DANCERS: 4 Male, 4 Female

Dancers of all ages required, must have excellent ability and technique. Acrobatics a bonus. We are seeking a lively, fresh faced, energetic group of dancers with a serious amount of style.


